## Special Note

### ERC revises planned eligibility restrictions

Following strong feedback from the research community, the European Research Council (ERC) has revised some of the stricter eligibility and resubmission rules that had been proposed for future ERC calls. The originally announced changes aimed to reduce pressure on the evaluation system by limiting resubmissions and tightening eligibility conditions, but raised concerns about their impact on early-career and interdisciplinary researchers.

The ERC is also preparing broader changes for the 2026–2027 work programmes, including a stronger focus on the research idea rather than the applicant's CV, adjustments to proposal formats, and the introduction of new funding instruments.

### New Horizon Europe pilot call: RAISE Doctoral Networks for AI in Science

The European Commission has launched the new pilot call *RAISE Doctoral Networks for AI in Science (HORIZON-RAISE-2026-01-MSCA)* under Horizon Europe. Building on the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Doctoral Networks scheme, the call supports interdisciplinary PhD training programmes that apply AI to scientific research and discovery.

The pilot is also relevant for researchers in the social sciences, particularly in areas such as computational social science, AI and society, digital governance, behavioural data analysis, public policy, and interdisciplinary AI research.

The call opened on 28 May 2026 and closes on 24 November 2026, with a total budget of €30 million.

### **Overview of the Health Calls 2026 and 2027 from Horizon Europe**

The European Commission has published the Horizon Europe work programme for the Health Cluster, including the general annexes and general introduction. The HNN3.0 (Health NCP) community has created an overview with a structured and clear table of the Cluster 1 'Health' calls for 2026 and 2027, including a list of relevant and helpful information, e.g. Funding specifics and Cross cutting priorities.

### **New calls**

#### **EU LIFE Programme – Opportunities for FSW researchers (open to all disciplines)**

The calls of the EU LIFE Programme (opened 21 April) may be interesting for FSW researchers working on the societal, behavioural and governance aspects of sustainability, climate and energy transitions. In particular, the Clean Energy Transition (CET) calls focus on coordination and support-type actions aimed at removing barriers to the energy transition, with funding rates up to 95%.

Unlike Horizon Europe, LIFE does not fund fundamental research, but focuses on implementation, upscaling, and real-world impact. This makes it especially relevant for research on behavioural change, policy, stakeholder engagement and interdisciplinary collaboration in societal transitions.

Deadline: 16 September 2026

#### **Rolling Call for Applications Singapore–Horizon Europe Complementary Fund (several disciplines)**

The Singapore–Horizon Europe Complementary Fund (SG-HE), administered by the National Research Foundation Singapore, provides funding for Singapore-based researchers to participate in collaborative projects under Horizon Europe. This scheme is relevant for Leiden researchers involved in Horizon Europe consortia who are looking to include or strengthen collaboration with partners in Singapore.

The call will remain open on a rolling basis through 31 Dec 2027

#### **CIIC Learning Communities for IX Talent and Skills (ECS, Psychology)**

Interested in making contributions to learning and working around immersive experiences (IX) as a researcher together with education and practice? A new call for proposals aimed at the realisation of CIIC Learning Communities will open in May. This call connects innovation, learning and working.

### **Reducing drug-related harm through effective social interventions (NWA)**

This call invites researchers and societal organisations to form a consortium that researches societal innovations aimed at reducing drug(-related) harm. The consortium will investigate the mechanisms through which drug(-related) harm arises. It will also develop and improve policy interventions to reduce drug-related harm.

Deadline Pre-proposal: 7 July 2026 /Deadline full application: 30 March 2027

### **NWA Citizen Science 2026: Funding for citizen–researcher collaborations**

The NWA Citizen Science 2026 call supports collaborations between citizen collectives and researchers within the Routes of the National Research Agenda (NWA). The programme aims to address societal challenges by combining citizens' lived experiences and insights with scientific expertise to jointly develop solutions.

The application deadline is 17 September 2026, by 14:00:00 CEST. Note that there is an earlier deadline on 3 September 2026, by 14:00:00 CEST for submitting a request for the assessment of Dutch/foreign organisations participating in the collaboration.

### **Preparing for Tomorrow: Societies and Strategies in Times of Transition (Political Science, CADS, Psychology)**

This call seeks to foster interdisciplinary and transnational research, reflecting the complex interplay between global crises, emerging technologies, and evolving societal values. We invite researchers to submit project proposals that contribute to new knowledge and tools to support a shared vision of a resilient and inclusive global future responsive to emerging challenges.

Deadline: 8 July 2026 (Letter of Intent) and 28 October 2026 (full proposal)

## **Current calls**

### **The power of collaboration (Political Science, CADS, Psychology)**

NWA stimulates collaboration between different partners, so that the whole is greater than the sum of its parts and new knowledge is developed for social challenges. The Power of Collaboration programme aims to boost scientific and societal impact by building on the knowledge, insights, and practical approaches from earlier NWA projects.

Deadline: 16 June 2026

### **KIC - Cooling needs in homes: effects, mitigation, adaptation (CADS, Psychology)**

Climate change and urbanisation are causing increased indoor temperatures, which in turn increases cooling demand in homes. In this KIC programme, NWO encourages interdisciplinary research into local heat differences, the consequences of overheating and the increasing need for cooling in different types of homes. The goal of this call is to reduce this cooling demand and to meet the remaining demand to achieve a healthy and comfortable indoor climate.

Deadline: 23 June 2026

### **KIC Integrated Biorefineries for a Circular Future (CADS, Psychology, Political Science)**

The transition within the chemical industry from fossil feedstock to biobased materials involves technical, social, economic and legal changes. In this programme, NWO collaborates with the Brazilian funding organisation FAPESP to connect scientists, industry, agricultural companies and societal partners to jointly find a solution to these problems.

Online matchmakings will take place in March and April 2026 (not mandatory)

Deadline for submission of the mandatory Letter of intent: 23 June 2026

Deadline for submission of Proposals: 20 October 2026

### **NWO Hop-On Call for Proposals for Researchers Based in Ukraine 2025 (all disciplines)**

Dutch and Ukrainian researchers will once again have the opportunity to collaborate with the 'NWO Hop-On Call for Researchers Based in Ukraine'. NWO and the National Research Foundation of Ukraine (NRFU) will open a second funding round within their collaborative initiative in January 2026.

Deadline: 23 June 2026 or until the budget has been exhausted. Applications are to be awarded on a "first come – first served" basis.

### **Security & Resilience of Digital Ecosystems (socio-technical focus) (open to several disciplines)**

This call funds research on how to strengthen the security and resilience of digital ecosystems in the Netherlands, combining technological solutions with insights into governance, behaviour and organisation. A security by design / security by default approach is encouraged.

Relevant for researchers interested in governance & public administration, political science, organisational studies, psychology, communication science, and data & society — in collaboration with technical partners.

Deadline: 15 September 2026

### **KIC Demand-driven Research by Consortia -S 2026 (open to all disciplines)**

Cybersecurity, climate, circular economy, housing shortage, ageing population or health: our society faces enormous challenges that require knowledge and groundbreaking innovations. This demands collaboration between researchers, businesses, and public social partners to develop innovative solutions and implement them successfully. This Call for proposals stimulates this collaboration and funds new and existing public-private consortia.

Deadline: 22 September 2026

### **Research along Routes by Consortia 2026 (NWA-ORC) (open to all disciplines)**

In the annual ORC funding round, consortia can submit thematic proposals that provide a joint expression of the breadth and innovative character of the NWA. The funding round is aimed at facilitating research that leads to scientific and/or societal breakthroughs.

Note: Participation in collaborative workshops (February and March) is mandatory for main applicants.

Deadline: 6 October 2026

### **Take-off phase 1 – Feasibility studies WO 2026 (open to all disciplines)**

Enterprising scientists who want to investigate whether it is feasible to commercially apply an innovative research result can apply for funding via Take-off phase 1 - Feasibility studies WO. This program is aimed at stimulating and supporting economic activity and entrepreneurship on the basis of science.

Deadline: 10 December 2026

### **KIC Societal Earning Capacity: Connection, Synthesis and Knowledge Utilisation (Political Science, CADS, Psychology)**

This top-up call calls for consortia from the previous KIC Mission calls to request extra budget intended for connection, synthesis and knowledge utilisation from the knowledge that is gained during their research. This call hopes to contribute to bringing together, integrating and making knowledge available in other contexts and has as its purpose to accelerate mission-driven innovation and to create Societal Earning Capacity.

Deadline: 21 January 2027

### **Ongoing calls**

#### **Take-off phase 1 – Feasibility studies WO 2026**

Enterprising scientists who want to investigate whether it is feasible to commercially apply an innovative research result can apply for funding via Take-off phase 1 - Feasibility studies WO. This program is aimed at stimulating and supporting economic activity and entrepreneurship on the basis of science.

Applications can be submitted continuously until 10 December 2026

#### **Computing Time on National Computing Facilities (open to all disciplines)**

Through the Call for Proposals Computing Time on National Computer Facilities 2026, researchers and research groups can gain access to computing time and the associated data services and expertise on the national advanced computer systems Supercomputer Snellius, Data Processing (Grid/Spider), HPC Cloud (via SURF Research Cloud) and support from SURF.

#### **Open Access Books (open to all disciplines)**

Project leaders or co-applicants of awarded NWO research projects can apply for funding of the costs of Open Access publishing of academic books that result from NWO funding.

Deadline: continuous

#### **Cooperation Germany - Von Humboldt Stiftung (VHS) (open to all disciplines)**

The NWO invites eminent researchers to nominate German candidates for a Von Humboldt Prize and German researchers to nominate Dutch candidates. The aim is to encourage international collaboration between excellent researchers.

Deadline: continuous

#### **Humboldt Research Fellowship (open to all disciplines)**

The Humboldt Research Fellowship for researchers of all nationalities and research areas: We support you with your research in Germany.

### **Current calls**

#### **Academische bruggenbouwers ouderengeneeskunde 2026**

Universities and university medical centres (UMCs) may apply for funding for a research project in which the training of clinical researchers in geriatric medicine is central.

Deadline: 4 Juni 2026

#### **Toetsing in de praktijk: Innovaties voor betere hulp- en zorgverlening bij gokschade**

This call aims to improve care and support for people experiencing or at risk of gambling harm. The goal is to test in practice how effective already developed (preventive) interventions, guidelines, services, products, processes, or procedures are. Deadline: 9 June 2026

This funding call focuses on the development of new, applicable knowledge necessary for the prevention of cycling accidents and the reduction of injury severity. This knowledge should provide a basis for guidelines on infrastructure, new policy measures, and behavioural interventions.

### **Samen Sterk in de Wlz – Long-Term Mental Health Care**

This funding call supports practice-oriented research within long-term mental health care under the Dutch Long-Term Care Act (Wlz). Projects should address practical questions on how formal and informal caregivers can work together to provide care and support, with the perspective of people with long-term mental health conditions at the centre.

Deadline: 7 July 2026

### **Samen Sterk in de Wlz – Long-Term Elderly Care**

This funding call supports practice-oriented research within long-term elderly care under the Dutch Long-Term Care Act (Wlz). Projects should address practical questions on how formal and informal caregivers can work together to provide care and support, with the perspective of older adults at the centre.

Deadline: 7 July 2026

### **NWA Reducing Drug Harm – Pre-proposals (Phase 1)**

This funding call invites researchers, societal organisations and citizens to form a consortium to investigate the mechanisms underlying drug-related harm and to develop and improve policy interventions to reduce such harm. The programme follows a two-phase process: in Phase 1, up to four pre-proposals will be selected. These teams will then participate in facilitated synergy workshops to develop a single joint consortium proposal for Phase 2.

Deadline Phase 1 pre-proposals: 7 July 2026

Deadline full proposal: 30 March 2027

### **News**

The Academy regards awards as an important means of showcasing outstanding and promising researchers. They also serve to spotlight specific areas of research and/or the arts. In addition, the Academy runs a number of incentive programmes specifically meant to encourage research excellence, in particular among young scientists and scholars. The Academy offers several awards and funding possibilities.

NIAS - one of the institutes of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences (KNAW) – has made it its mission to provide a physical and intellectual space for advanced research in the humanities and social sciences that is driven by curiosity and cross-discipline collaboration.

### **Current calls**

#### **KNAW Early Career Award (open to all disciplines)**

The KNAW Early Career Award encourages the further development of a diverse range of early career scientists and scholars who have made valuable and innovative contributions to science or scientific practice. These contributions may relate to the themes identified in [the Recognition & Rewards programme](#): research, education, impact, patient care (in university medical centres), or leadership.

Deadline: 1 July 2026

### **Current Calls**

#### **MSH Val de Loire Visiting Researchers Programme (open to all disciplines)**

Le Studium offers a new Visiting Researchers Programme in partnership with the Maison des Sciences sociales et des Humanités: Cities and urban studies; Money, economy and finance; Environmental

Humanities; Transmission(s), transfer(s), re-appropriation(s); Human interaction and Data Science; Health in all its forms. It offers residency periods of 3 to 10 months.

Deadline: 4 June 2026

#### **KFZ Call 2026 (Psychology, ECS)**

The KFZ Programme launches one call round annually. During this call round, KFZ makes funding available for projects relevant to forensic care, such as scientific research or the development of guidelines and interventions. The current themes are: The Use of Lived Experience Expertise in Forensic Care, Dealing with Stigma in Forensic Care, Working with Forensic Clients with Mild Intellectual Disabilities (MID) in Supported Housing / Sheltered Accommodation and Social Care and an Open Call (topic to be determined independently)

Deadline: 13 September 2026

#### **Holberg Prize (open to all disciplines)**

The Holberg Prize is an international prize awarded for outstanding contributions to research in the arts and humanities, social sciences, law and theology.

Anyone holding an academic position at a university, academy or other research institution may nominate candidates for the Holberg Prize.

#### **Hanse-Wissenschaftskolleg Fellowship 2025 (Psychology)**

The Fellowship program offers the opportunity to focus on research without the distraction of everyday routines in academia and to interact with colleagues in a vibrant international and interdisciplinary Fellow community that also includes Artists and Writers in Residence.

#### **Hanse-Wissenschaftskolleg Fellowship 2025 (Psychology)**

#### **Call for Proposals: Collaborate with the University of Zurich through the Global Funding Scheme**

Through Leiden University's membership in the Una Europa alliance, Leiden University and LUMC staff can participate in proposals for the University of Zurich's (UZH) Global Funding Scheme in collaboration with UZH colleagues (applications must be submitted by a UZH researcher).

The scheme offers three funding lines: the Global Outreach Fund and Global Seed Fund (up to CHF 5,000 / approx. €5,300 each), and the Global Champion Fund (CHF 20,000–60,000 / approx. €21,000–64,000) for larger-scale collaborations with strong institutional support and long-term impact potential. In 2025, three projects from Leiden University's Faculty of Humanities were successfully funded through this call.

Deadline: 31 July 2026

#### **Fritz Thyssen Foundation: Support of Projects (open to all disciplines)**

Support of projects by the Fritz Thyssen Foundation focuses on scholars in the humanities, social sciences and biomedicine fields. The planned project should be limited in terms of the subject and time.

Deadline: 1 September 2026

#### **Open Science Meetings (open to all disciplines)**

Both researchers and research support staff may submit an application for financial support for organising an open science meeting.

Deadline: 10 December 2026

## **Continuous Submission Opportunities and recurring calls**

#### **Andrew Carnegie Foundation (Education and Child studies, CADS and political sciences)**

Andrew Carnegie envisioned Carnegie Corporation as a foundation that would "promote the advancement and diffusion of knowledge and understanding".

### **BIMTECH Research Fellowship for Young Global Scholars (open to all disciplines)**

The BIMTECH Research Fellowship scheme is to provide opportunities to researchers from foreign B Schools/Universities to undertake advanced studies in India leading to research outcomes. Ongoing; 3 selection moments per year: in March, July and November.

### **The British Academy: Global Professorships (open to all disciplines)**

This programme aims to demonstrate and further enhance the UK's commitment to international research partnerships and collaboration as well as strengthen the UK's research capacity and capability in the humanities and the social sciences.

### **Emmy Noether Programme DFG Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (open to all disciplines)**

Outstanding junior researchers can rapidly qualify for leading positions in science and research or for a university teaching career by heading an independent junior research group and assuming relevant teaching duties. Proposals can be submitted to the DFG at any time.

### **European University Institute**

The European University Institute (EUI), located in Florence, Italy, is Europe's postgraduate and postdoctoral research university dedicated to the social sciences and humanities. It offers several fellowships (e.g. postdoctoral studies and visiting fellows): [Educational programmes](#)

### **Gerda Henkel Stiftung PhD Scholarships and programmes (open for several disciplines)**

In line with one of the founder's wishes, a special focus of the Gerda Henkel Foundation is support for up-and-coming scholars. Special attention is made when approving grants to enable qualified young researchers of both sexes to conduct scientific work for a limited period of time and in order to improve their academic training. Applications for PhD scholarships are considered throughout the year.

### **Harry Frank Guggenheim foundation (Political science, CADS and Psychology)**

The Harry Frank Guggenheim Foundation supports work in the social and natural sciences and aligned disciplines to increase understanding of the causes, manifestations, and control of violence in the contemporary world. Priority is given to work that addresses urgent, present-day problems of violence—what produces it, how it operates, and what prevents or reduces it.

### **Heisenberg Programme (open to all disciplines)**

If you already meet all the requirements for appointment to a permanent professorship, you can apply to the Heisenberg Programme. While you prepare for a future senior academic role, the DFG provides funding to enable you to carry on with high-quality research at the institution of your choice and continue building your academic reputation.

### **Hersenstichting (Psychology)**

Qualified researchers affiliated with neuroscience institutes and research centres may submit an application to the Hersenstichting for funding to support their research.

### **IASH (University of Edinburgh) (open to all disciplines)**

Several Fellowship programmes for external researchers.

### **Max-Planck-Gesellschaft (open to all disciplines)**

The Max Planck Society is one of Europe's leading basic research organizations. In its research laboratories, workshops, libraries, and administration, scientists and researchers perform demanding tasks with a high degree of autonomy and creativity. Various calls and deadlines.
