

Windows 10: Frequently asked questions

Why are Office macros not working?

For reasons of security, macros in Word and other Office applications are disabled by default. You can enable them via the Trust Center. In Word or Excel, click File > Options > Trust Center and then [Trust Center Settings]. Then choose *Macro settings*, edit your preferences and close all windows.

How can I change my default printer?

1. Click the Start button and then in the left column the Settings button (cogwheel).
2. Go to Devices > Printers & scanners and make sure the check box *Let Windows manage my default printer* is switched off.
3. Now, click the printer that you want to be your default and then click the [Manage] button, followed by [Set as default].

Where is my Outlook signature?

Your mail signature is not automatically migrated to Outlook 2016. You can restore your signature(s) as follows:

1. In Outlook, open a mail message with your signature and cut or copy this signature.
2. Click *New mail > Signature > Signatures*.
3. In the signatures window click [New], type a name for the signature and paste the signature in the *Edit signature* field. If you wish, you may also set the signature defaults in the top right corner of the signature window. Finally, close the Signatures window with [OK].

How can I connect a functional (shared) mailbox?

Why am I sometimes asked to log in again?

If you are using a laptop as your workplace, Outlook and other Office applications may ask you to log in again after your laptop entered its energy saving mode. This may also happen after switching to an other network. In these cases, please add the prefix `vuw\` to your username. For instance, if your username is `johnsonj`, then log in with `vuw\johnsonj` and your usual ULCN password.

How can I enable the Flash player?

Flash support will stop by the end of 2020 and therefore, more and more browsers are blocking the Flash Player. You can (temporarily) enable the Flash player in most browsers, as explained below.
