

1. Introduction to Comenius



Johannes Amos Comenius (1592-1670)

Pedagogue and education innovator



"to give impetus to educational innovation and improvements by professionals in higher education"

Innovation:

- is evidence-informed
- needs to **improve** teaching practice (i.e. help solve a current problem)
- needs to directly benefit students
- is considered **innovative** for Dutch higher education (beyond LeidenUniv.)
- derives from the fellow's own **vision** on education
- experiences and results will be **evaluated and shared** within the (nationwide) HE teaching community
- contribute to the **professional development and career** of a Comenius Fellow

Teaching Fellow: Objectives

(pending call 2024)

- 1. Impact own students within single course/defined study program
- 2. Supported by a team of direct colleagues, advisers and students
- 3. Potential to serve as best **practice example** within and outside the institution

No limit to the number of proposals per university.

Expected experience: 2+ years

Project duration: 12-18 months

Budget: €45-50,000

Impact: course level

Senior Fellow: Objectives

(pending call 2024)

- Impact on education in one or more large bachelor/master programs or at Faculty level
- 2. A team proposal with a combination of experts and leadership in teaching and research
- 3. Contribute to the **educational knowledge base**

Maximum of one proposal per Faculty (or interfaculty institute), process for internal selection by each Faculty.

Expected experience: 5+ years

Project duration: 24-30 months

Budget: €90-100,000

Impact: faculty level

Themes Call 2024

THEME	AIM
Theme 1: Education forms of the future	Focus on the question of how innovative education forms and technological developments can be developed and implemented in a useful way into higher education, to improve students' learning. Consider, for example, hybrid education forms, working beyond disciplines, and shaping education together with students.
Theme 2: Diversity and inclusion	Focus on making education or the educational environment more inclusive for students . Diversity in background or beliefs, as well as in the education sector as a whole could be considered here.
Theme 3: Connecting to the labour market	Focus on preparing students for the changing labour market of the future . Consider, for example, the increasing shortage in the labour market and what this will demand of graduate students. Or major transitions as a result of which students will need different skills for a sustainable and healthy career.
Theme 4: Open theme	Projects within this theme focus on topics that arise from the teacher's curiosity in education design. These are projects that contribute to the innovation and improvement of higher education for the benefit of students.

- Letter of intent: beginning of September
- Preliminary application: **beginning of October** (summary, problem outline, innovative character, expected results)
- Full application: **December/January** (project plan, budget, statement)
- Senior only: rebuttal in **Spring**

Assessing your proposal



Criteria:

- 1. Innovative nature (30%)
- 2. Expected result (20%)
- 3. Quality of project plan (20%)
- 4. Teaching experience and vision of the applicant (30%)

Reviewing committee:

- Thematic experts
- Educational researchers
- Experienced innovators
- Students!



Tips & tricks for a successful project

- Students should directly benefit! Include students in every aspect of your application: problem, innovation, project team, evaluation, impact
- Innovation is the starting point: pay enough attention to innovative nature
- Write **evidence-based**: show, don't tell
- Think **problem-based**: do you provide a solution for a real problem? Is it clear what specific problem you seek to address?
- Define your **intended results** as clearly as possible
- Be very specific to **translate your vision into activities**: concrete action plan
- Make a clear distinction between activities in **project phases**
- Start thinking about what is feasible within the **budget** when shaping your plans and building your team, even if the budget isn't required until the end
- Plan the timeline and methods of **evaluation** and **dissemination** ahead
- Developing teaching material and/or conducting educational research can be part of a project, but may **not be the ultimate goal**.
- Show your **personal vision**: what do **you** think?

Results Call 2022: universities

(full results 2023 not yet available)

Teaching Fellows:


- 100 submitted Letters of Intent
- 80 preliminary proposals
- 36 final proposals
- 20 projects granted
- Success rate of 56%

Leadership Fellows:

- 5 submitted Letters of Intent
- 4 final proposals (cq. 2023: 7)
- 3? interviews
- 2 projects to be granted
- Success rate of 50% (cq. '23: 29%)

Senior Fellows:

- 39 submitted Letters of Intent
- 33 preliminary proposals
- 19 final proposals (cq. 2023: 24)
- 11 projects to be granted
- Success rate of 58% (cq. 2023: 46%)

Critical moments


- December/early January: draft ready, build team, budget

Suggestions

Good planning is key

- Have an advanced draft ready early/mid December
- Be prepared to sacrifice your Christmas Holidays
- Start budgeting early
- Involve Faculty/Department
- Build team > Networking / Snowball method
- Importance of rebuttal and do not despair!
- Great idea? Go for it!

Problem:

 We need to better prepare students for evaluating the merits of quantitative evidence.

Project goal:

- Replication of quantitative analyses is a fantastic teaching tool that allows students to develop statistical and scientific literacy.
